## 2024 Programs at Lighthouse Guilt Guild

**May 13 Shae Vaughn** - Custom Free-Motion Quilter & Independent Quilt Historian - Exploring History Through Antique Quilts.

Shae Vaughn, a quilt historian from Kalamazoo, will speak with us about "Discovering the Story: Experiencing History Through Antique Quilts ". Shae comes to quilts from a long family line, beginning at an earlier age than her grandmother. She will talk about how the contemporary quilting world intersects with quilting history. Shae will be bringing quilts of her own to display and talk about. Two things your program committee has planned for this evening: FIRST, you, as members, can bring in quilts you have at home or in your family and set them up on several long tables so all members can "ooohh and aaahh" at your treasure; SECOND, if you want Shae to give you historical info on your quilt, she can offer evaluations of the date of the quilt and any important observations or connections to the era that she sees, or any distinctive fabrics or patterns or other characteristics in your treasures. You may set up a time for this at the Program Table for her comments, \$20 for her time. She does not do any appraisals. She will not give a value. Remember, sign up at the program table next meeting so we can plan for your time with her. Depending upon how much interest members have, it may be prior to the meeting or after. We will call you to make time arrangements.

We have so many books for you to choose from, come check out our Guild library! We have books with embroidery, beginner quilts, fiber arts quilts and quilts for advanced quilters.



# My favorite quick donation quilt



#### Approximate amount of fabric needed/cutting instructions

**1 yard** of a focus fabric – cut 5 strips 6.5 inches by WOF <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> yard of tone on tone – cut 6 strips 3 inches by WOF

(1 yard if you use this fabric for binding)

1/2 yard of accent fabric - cut 10 strips 1.5 inches by WOF

(1 yard if you use this fabric for binding)

- Assemble as shown in the picture above please note that the top and bottom strips do not have accent strips sewn on the outside edges of the quilt.
- I sew all my accent strips to my tone on tone strips first and then sew them to the focus fabric.
- If your focus fabric is directional, pay attention to how it's orientated as you sew the sections together.
- You can choose to use either the tone on tone or accent fabric for binding just adjust the yardage needed.
- Quilt size is approximately 41 x 56.
