In anticipation of this Kathy is offering a Natural Indigo Dyeing class on September 14th from 10am to 2pm. It will be in Kathy's yard and the cost is \$60. Setting up a natural Indigo vat and resisting methods of clamping, bundling, Arashi pole wrapping and more. You may also want to try some Shibori. Check out YouTube for some simple stitching that you can do before class. Material List: 3 yards of PFD (prepared for dyeing) 100% cotton or cotton washed with Dawn dishwashing soap and hot water. Bring dishwashing type gloves and your lunch. Wear clothes and shoes you don't mind getting blue spots on!

### **PALS Winter Retreat**

#### December 13-15, 2024

**Location:** The Christian Reformed Conference Campground is located at 12253 Lakeshore Drive, Grand Haven, 49417, just north of M45 (Lake Michigan Drive) and on the west (lake) side of the road. When you enter, drive west to the Gathering Center next to the Agape cabin.

**Hours:** The doors will open at 7:00 am each day and we will be done by 3:00 pm on Sunday. Please do not arrive earlier than 9:00am on Friday as we need time to set-up. Quilters are welcome to sew until late in the evening, <u>last</u> person out will lock up and turn irons off.

**Sewing Information:** We sew in a large, open, festive space with a warm gas fireplace, natural daylight, and overhead lighting. We'll provide extension cords, 4 large cutting mats, ironing boards and irons. If you have a big cutting project, you may want to cut ahead or bring your own mat. If you want your own iron remember to bring a pressing mat. Also bring:

- Sewing machine in good working order, plus bobbins and thread. (Don't forget your machine's cord.)
- Rotary cutter and ruler(s)
- Standard sewing supplies for your project(s)
- · Pillow for your chair
- A snack to share at the community table
- A flashlight as it is going to be dark when getting to your car or cottage at night.
- Name tag or badge
- · Yard sale items and cash to buy some treasures

**Yard Sale:** You will have a chance to sell up to 10 sewing or quilting related items at the yard sale. Have your items clearly marked with a price and your name. Money will be exchanged between the buyer and seller.

**Food:** Meals will be around 12:00 for lunch and 5:00-5:30 for dinner. Breakfast is on your own. Water will be available all day with pop at meals. You are welcome to bring your own drinks. We will have a snack table so please bring something to share.

The cabin has a full kitchen you can also use for drinks and breakfast.

#### There is a "No Alcohol" policy at the Conference Grounds.

\*We only have space for 18 people and 9 of them can be overnight.
