PALS program for June of 2025 will be All About Indigo Dyeing with Kathy Jolman. It will also feature quilts and projects by Guild members who experienced the joy of Indigo Dyeing! In anticipation of this Kathy is offering a Natural Indigo Dyeing class on September 14th from 10am to 2pm. It will be in Kathy's yard and the cost is \$60. Setting up a natural Indigo vat and resisting methods of clamping, bundling, Arashi pole wrapping and more. You may also want to try some Shibori. Check out YouTube for some simple stitching that you can do before class. Material List: 3 yards of PFD (prepared for dyeing) 100% cotton or cotton washed with Dawn dishwashing soap and hot water. Bring dishwashing type gloves and your lunch. Wear clothes and shoes you don't mind getting blue spots on!

Easy Project Sheet Compliments of Field's Fabrics

# STRING SLING BAG

Great gift idea! Choose from our many fabric print themes to personalize your bag.


Supplies:


- ½ yard fabric (cotton, denim, nylon, suede, fleece, etc.)
- 2½ yards cording
  Thread to match or contrast
- Purchase 4½ yds. cording for backpack version

## Instructions:

Cut fabric into a rectangle that is 18" X 44" wide (or smaller if desired). Fold in half with right sides together and stitch both 22" sides using \( \frac{1}{2} \)" seam allowance. Turn Upper raw edge under \( \frac{1}{2} \)", press. Turn down 1" forming a casing and press. Edge stitch along lower edge, leaving a 2" opening by the seam of one side. Fig. 1. Turn bag right side out and press.

Mark the bottom corner (on fold of the side where there is an opening in the casing - see fig. 1) 3" over and 3"up the side. Sew from one mark to the other forming a triangle. Mark and stitch a 1" buttonhole in the corner at an angle. Put a safety pin on one end of the cording and use it to pull the cording through the casing. Securely knot the 2 ends of the cording through the buttonhole. Pull strings to close bag.





## Backpack Option:

Make two 2" openings in the casing - one at each side seam. Pull cording through casing (both pieces). Follow directions above for "triangle" stitching and putting buttonholes in each lower corner. Securely knot cording through each buttonhole.
